

Request for Applications – EPIC Project – Slovenia – Round 2

Internews invites applications for the second round of its **Expansion of Production of Independent Content** Project in Slovenia.

Your stories

We are looking to support innovative and use constructive story approaches and high-quality (audio)visual storytelling tools and can potentially reach a wide range of audiences with accessible content.

The series should tell a story or multiple related stories about **issues of public interest in Slovenia**, including, but not limited to:

- longevity society (pensions, long-term care, social structure),
- mental health,
- housing,
- quality of life,
- access to public healthcare and education,
- digitalization and user-friendly administration and public services,
- energy supply,
- migration and minorities,
- climate change,
- electoral and judicial system,
- fake advertisements.

Multimedia storytelling tools may include, but are not limited to photography, videography, animation, captioned video, infographics (charts, maps, data visualizations), graphics, drawings, audio segments, interactivity or even gamification.

What is being offered?

Grants are up to USD 15,000 for content production. These funds can cover production costs, salaries, equipment, and other reasonable expenses. Additional funding of up to USD 1,500 can be available for promotion, and professional support and expert consultancy is also available at no extra cost for successful applicants.

EPIC also supports regional cross-border networking and content sharing and hosts online and in-person events.

Who is eligible?

Independent local, regional or national media organizations, who have been publishing Slovenian language content for at least a year for audiences in Slovenia.

Applicants must self-identify as independent, follow an independent editorial policy, have proved dedication to professional journalistic ethics and standards, have a record of producing clear, unbiased, pluralistic content about issues of public interest.

Public media are not eligible to apply for grants under this call.

How to apply?

Please fill out 1) the application form and 2) attach your proposed budget.



Only fully completed applications, submitted on time and in line with the full *Request for Applications* will be considered. The deadline for submission of applications: 23:59 CET **November 18, 2024.**

Applications will be assessed by a selection panel of independent media experts and Internews staff.

Decisions on awarding the grants will be made within fifteen (15) working days after the deadline for applications. The six-month implementation period will start upon signing of the grant agreement, foreseeably between January 1, 2025 and June 30, 2025.
